## Canine Distemper in dogs

Canine Distemper is a contagious viral disease that affects a number of mammals that can damage the nervous system and respiratory system of the affected animal.

### How dangerous CD is?

Distemper has high mortality rate in un-treated animals. Dogs who are unvaccinated are at high risk of CD. Adult dogs are more survivable while CD can be mortal in puppies.



### What are the symptoms ?

Distemper dogs have wide range of symptoms depends of their immunity and stage of the disease. Common symptoms include nasal and eye discharge, coughing, lethargy, body twitching, seizures, neurological dis coordination, inappetance, dehydration, vomiting and diarrhea etc.

### Is CD curable ?

Though there is no precise medication available for CD, with supportive medication, secondary infections can be prevented. Treatment can reduce symptoms and intensity of the condition. Everyday treatment would be recommended by the vet for a period of time. The disease leaves permanent nervous issues to the affected animal, even after recovery.

### How CD spreads ?

Canines get CD mostly by airborne exposure- through sneezing/ coughing of affected animal. Humans can be carriers of the virus that can be spread to your pets, though it does not spread to humans.

Consult your veterinarian immediately when you notice any of the above mentioned symptoms or changes in activity level.

**Make sure your pets / street dogs are vaccinated with DHPP vaccines to prevent Canine Distemper. Get more details from your vet.**
